Objectives

- Prevent: Empower communities with knowledge to reduce the spread of HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis C.
- Test: Increase testing rates and early diagnosis to improve health outcomes.
- Support: Provide accessible treatment, reduce stigma, and promote health equity in ACB communities.



Prevention Strategies

- HIV Prevention: Use condoms, access PrEP and PEP, and avoid sharing injection equipment.
- Hepatitis C Prevention: Follow safe practices for medical procedures and avoid sharing needles or equipment.
